VOTING IN LEE COUNTY

leeco.us

You must be registered at least **14** days before an election.

Qualifications: US citizen, Lee County resident, at least 18 years old, never convicted of [certain felonies](#) (or rights restored—bring proof), never legally declared mentally incompetent.

Where to Register

ONLINE: <http://www.alabamavotes.gov/>

In Person: Complete application form at Board of Registrars (1st floor Courthouse), Drivers License Office, some libraries, County Human Resources Office, Medicaid Agency, Armed Forces Recruiting Stations, WIC Program, Health Department, Rehabilitation Services, or Secretary of State website (sos.state.al.us).

By Mail: Obtain registration postcard from Probate Judge's Office, public 4-year colleges/universities, or agencies listed above. Return the completed card to: Board of Registrars, PO Box 1530, Opelika, AL 36803-1530. **Card must reach Registrars 14 days before election.** You should receive a confirmation card showing your voting place.

Absentee Voting: Obtain application online at AlabamaVotes.gov or in person at 205 South 10th Street, Opelika, or by mail at PO Box 1616, Opelika, Alabama, 36803. Call 334.737.3490 or 800.239.4469 for other information.

Applications: available 40 days before election from the Election Manager or online from Secretary of State's website (sos.state.al.us), where Federal Postcard Applications and information on absentee voting for the military are also available. Return completed application in person or by mail to the Manager so that it is received at least 5 days before election (one application per envelope). No one can return an application in person for another person.

Ballots: available in person at the Manager's Office or by mail. If completed in person, staff will witness the signature. If mailed, the outer envelope requires two witnesses. Enclose a copy of your ID unless you are exempt (see directions). **Mailed ballots must be received by noon on election day. Ballots returned in person must be received at the Election Manager's office by 4:30 pm the day before the election.**

Absentee voting for city elections follows the same process but is conducted by an election manager in the Auburn or Opelika City Hall.

ELECTIONS AND TERMS OF OFFICE

Party Primaries: Usually 1st Tuesday in June.

General Elections: Tuesday after 1st Monday in November in even years. Governor, Constitutional Officers, and Legislators will be elected in 2022 for 4 years. County Commissioners will be elected in 2020 and 2022 to staggered 4-year terms.

Special elections: Referenda on bond issues, constitutional amendments, and taxes at times specified in legislative acts.

Municipal Elections: Non-partisan, administered by cities on the last Tuesday in August every 4 years: Auburn in 2022, Opelika in 2024.

PHOTO ID NOW REQUIRED TO VOTE

A current, valid government-issued PHOTO ID is now required to vote. A list of acceptable forms is available at sos.state.al.us. The ID card must contain a photo and may be a driver's license, nondriver ID card, photo voter ID card, US passport, federal or state government employee ID card, college or university ID card, military ID card or tribal ID card.

A free photo voter ID card is available to anyone who lacks the above-listed photo ID options. Proof of birth date, legal name and address are required for free ID.
